This Turah ^(Torah) Portion is enriched with messianic parallels. As we go through this Turah ^(Torah) Portion try to find other links in scripture that ties in with the Mashiyach ^(Messiah). There are a lot more scriptures that show a messianic message that I have not put in this lesson.

A quick review from 2 shabbath's ago, concerning what was the characteristics of a righteous seed verses and unrighteous seed. Who did we use? And what were their occupations?

- Righteous are characterized as being Shepherds:
 - Abraham, Yatskaq ^(Isaac), Ya'aqub ^(Jacob), Daud ^(David), & יהושע ^(Yahusha/Good Sheperd)
- Unrighteous were those of the Field which meant World
 - Shatan ^(Satan), Qayin ^(Cain), Eashu ^(Esau), etc.
 - We added one more person to the equation. Yashmae'al ^(Ishmael)

Have you all noticed that those of the natural born of the firstborn never received the Coveted Blessing?

- Qayin ^(Cain) & Habel ^(Abel), Yatskaq ^(Isaac) & Yashmae'al ^(Ishmael), Eashu ^(Esau) & Ya'aqub ^(Jacob), Yusaph ^(Joseph) & Reuben, Manasseh & Aphraiym ^(Ephraim). What do you think the Father wanted us to see? That it was also the same way with Adam He was the 2nd Adam 1 Corinthians 15:45-49

The numerical value 3 is very important in this Turah ^(Torah) Portion.

The 3rd Hebrew letter in the Hebrew Aleph Bet is Gimel “ג” which is a picture of a camel. The definition of this picture means to lift up, have self will, or pride. Basically how you walk will determine life or death or life from death.

- Yahuchanan ^(John) 2:13-21
- Mark 8:27-31
- Bereshiyth ^(Genesis) 1:11-13
- Uayiqra ^(Leviticus) 23 The Omer wave offering
- Yatskaq ^(Isaac) being a picture of the Mashiyach ^(Messiah) Bereshiyth ^(Genesis) 22:1-16
- Yunah ^(Jonah) being a sign according to Mashiyach ^(Messiah)
- Not to mention also, the Matriarchs, 3 being barren wombs

Why did Yusaph's ^(Joseph) brothers hate him? The dreams that he had given a picture that his family would bow down and serve him.

Ya'aqub ^(Jacob) sent Yusaph ^(Joseph) to Shekem, for what purpose? To find his brothers

- Bereshiyth ^(Genesis) 37:12-14
- Yahuchanan ^(John) 10:1-21

Bereshiyth ^(Genesis) 37:25-27 Yashmae'al ^(Ishmael) means, Al ^(El) will hear. Even though Ya'aqub ^(Jacob) was sold to the Yashmae'alites ^(Ishmaelites), Al ^(El) will still hear him.

Ya'aqub's ^(Jacob) brothers plotted against him

- Tehilliyim ^(Psalms) 2 {2:9 see Revelations 2:27}.
- Tehilliyim ^(Psalms) 41:9 {Friend is Shalom, in this verse}. Friends give you peace.
- Mattithyahu ^(Matthew) 26:59
- Mattithyahu ^(Matthew) 27:1
 - Potipher's wife gave false accusation on him
 - Mattithyahu ^(Matthew) 26:60

Ya'aqub's ^(Jacob) brothers did not kill him, but conspired to hand him over to the gentiles

- Yahuchanan ^(John) 18:28-19:42 **verse 31**
- In the end Yusaph ^(Joseph) saves not only his brothers and family but the gentiles as well.
 - His brothers could not recognize him on the second time they meet.

What was given to his Father so that he may recognize whom it belongs to? His garment

- Describe how he gave it his father? Bereshiyth ^(Genesis) 37:31-34
- See Revelations 19:13

Yusaph ^(Joseph) was sold to the gentiles. by whom? Yahudah

- Mashiyach ^(Messiah) was sold to the gentiles by Yahudah ^{(Yahudiym(s))}

Yusaph ^(Joseph) was in prison,

- Mashiyach ^(Messiah) was in prison Yashayahu ^(Isaiah) 53:8

When in Prison Yusaph ^(Joseph) interpreted two of Pharaoh's servant's dreams.

- One was promised life in 3 days and the other was promised death in 3 days
- The Butler or Cup Bearer was promised to be restored
- The Beaker was told on the 3rd day he would be Hanged on a tree
 - Acts 5:30; 10:39
- Note worthy: there was two that was going to be killed, one was promised life.
